Technical Specification for Genetic analyzer

 Equipment should perform advanced fully automated multi-capillary, fluorescence-based DNA Sequencing analysis.

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- Equipment should be able to do high performance sequencing reaction with wide range of chemicals and chemistry.
- Equipment should come with 8 or more capillaries in parallel that employ bare silica capillaries with a usage life that exceeds 160 runs. The system should have an option to upgrade to more capillaries to meet future throughput necessities.
- 4. Equipment should have CCD detection technology and a spectrograph for color separation.
- Equipment should have the ability to detect and analyze 6 or more fluorescent dyes simultaneously for DNA fragment analysis.
- 6. Equipment should come with single line 505 nm Solid-State long-life laser, utilizing a standard excitation source with power supply and without heat removal ducting.
- 7. Equipment should have signal uniformity and sensitivity with dual side illumination detection. It should be active at various temperatures in the range between 18 to 70°C.
- Equipment should have option for different capillary sizes for smaller fragment and large fragment sequencing analysis.
- Equipment should come with automatic Radio-Frequency Identification Technology to track key consumables data. In addition, the equipment should have the option to override the expiry date-based system.
- 10. The supplier should offer a personal computer along with the instrument with following specifications to acquire raw data. Processor- CoreTM 17-2600S Processor (2.8GHz) or better, Operating system-Genuine & Activated Windows (R) 8 Home Premium, Memory-8GB, Hard Drive-2TB 7200 RPM SATA Hard Drive, Monitor FHD, 23" touch Screen. - 11. The supplier should supply a powerful workstation that supports various sequence analysis with the following configurations: Intel Xeon processor with minimum 2 Core, 2.10 Ghz, 32 GB DDR4 RAM or above, 1 TB SSD or above, 23" or above widescreen LCD monitor and 4 or more USB 3.1 ports, 1 Scrial, Parallel, Ethernet ports; Intel Dual Band Wireless and activated Windows 10 Pro 64.
- 12. The vendor should supply all the necessary software for de novo, contig assembly, Re-sequencing, Long Read Sequencing, comparative sequencing, Fragment analysis applications like SSR, ISSR, AFLP Plant & Microbial Finger printing, HMA (Heteroduplex Mobility Assay), Microsatellite, Long Sizing, SSCP, SNP Validation and screening, Linkage analysis, LOH (Loss of Heterozygosity).
- 13. Equipment should have the capacity to perform serial analysis of gene expression sequencing, expressed sequence tag sequencing, gene regulation studies, microbial diversity analysis, epigenetic change analysis, genome analysis as well as re-sequencing.
- 14. The software should allow real-time data quality evaluation providing immediate access to base calling or size calling data to make decision about the quality of data as it is generated.
- 15. The vendor should supply all the necessary consumables and reagents to perform minimum 2000 sequencing reactions along with the instrument, with an adequate shelf life.
- 16. The supplier should perform installation, application, and operator training on site.
- 17. Should support by trained operator for minimum of two visits per year for two years for technical training.

- 18. Additionally, support with trained engineer for minimum of two visits per year for two years for maintenance.
- 19. All the equipment must support 220 Volt, 50 Hz electrical systems.
- Equipment should come with three years comprehensive warranty on all components including laser and the required service kits for the warranty period.
- 21. AMC -after the warranty period (optional)
- 22. All-in-one integrated Software for data analyses supporting the following features: cloning, primer design, pairwise & multiple sequence alignment, capability to convert the DNA sequence into protein sequence and perform structural and functional analyses. 1.1. ELIGIBLE BIDDERS.

- This Invitation for Bids is open to all suppliers. 1.1.1
- Bidders should not be associated, or have been associated in the past, directly or indirectly, 1.1.2 with a firm or any of its affiliates which have been engaged by the Purchaser to provide consulting services for the preparation of the design, specifications, and other documents to be used for the procurement of the goods to be purchased under this Invitation of Bids.

1.2. COST OF BIDDING

- The Bidder shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its bid, 1.2.1 and "the Purchaser", will in no case be responsible or liable for these costs, regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process. 1.3.
- FRAUD AND CORRUPTION:
- 1.3.1 The purchaser requires that the bidders/suppliers and contractors observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of such contracts.
- 1.3.2 The purchaser will reject a proposal for award if it determines that the Bidder recommended for award has, directly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive or coercive practices in competing for the Contract in question; The Bidding Documents
- 1.4. COST OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS
- Interested eligible bidders may download the document from our Website. However the bid 1.4.1 document cost to be paid during the submission of the bid. 1.5.
- CONTENT OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS
- The goods required, bidding procedures and contract terms are prescribed in the bidding 1.5.1 documents which should be read in conjunction. 1.5.2
- The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms, and specifications in the bidding documents. Failure to furnish all information required by the bidding documents or submission of a bid not substantially responsive to the bidding documents in every respect will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in rejection of 1.6.
- CLARIFICATION OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS
- 1.6.1 A prospective Bidder requiring any clarification of the Bidding Documents shall contact the Purchaser in writing via fax/email. The Purchaser will respond in writing to any request for clarification, provided that such request is received not later than ten (10) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids. The Purchaser shall forward copies of its response to all those who have acquired the Bidding Documents directly from it, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. Should the Purchaser deem it necessary to amend the Bidding Documents as a result of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under clause relating to amendment of Bidding documents and Clause relating to Deadline for Submission of Bids. - AMENDMENT OF BIDDING DOCUMENTS
- 1.7.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of bids, the Purchaser may, for any reason, whether at its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective bidder, modify the bidding documents by amendment.
- 1.7.2 All prospective bidders who have received the bidding documents will be notified of the amendment in writing or by e-mail and will be binding on them. The same would also be hosted on the website of the purchaser and all prospective bidders are expected to surf the website before submitting their bids to take cognizance of the amendments.

The Goods supplied and services rendered under this Contract shall conform to the standards mentioned in the Technical Specifications and Schedule of Requirements, and, when no applicable standard is mentioned, to the authoritative standard appropriate to the Goods' country of origin and such standards shall be the latest issued by the concerned institution.

- PERFORMANCE SECURITY 1.39
 - 1.39.1 Within 21 days of receipt of the notification of award/PO, the Supplier shall furnish performance security of 7% of Contract/ Purchase Order value in the amount specified in the Contract, valid till 60 days beyond the completion of contractual obligations.
 - The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the Purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the Supplier's failure to complete its obligations under the Contract.
 - The Performance Security shall be denominated in Indian Rupees for the offers received for supplies within India and denominated in the currency of the contract in the case of offers received for supply from foreign countries.
 - In the case of imports, the PS may be submitted either by the principal or by the Indian agent and, in the case of purchases from indigenous sources, the PS may be submitted by either the manufacturer or their authorized dealer/bidder.
 - 1.39.5 The Performance security shall be in one of the following forms:
 - (a) A Bank guarantee or stand-by Letter of Credit issued by a Nationalized/Scheduled bank located in India or a bank located abroad in the form provided in the bidding documents. Or,
 - (b) A Banker's cheque or Account Payee demand draft in favour of the purchaser. Or,
 - (c) A Fixed Deposit Receipt pledged in favour of the Purchaser.

PAYMENT TERMS 1.41

For Indigenous supplies payment will be made within 30 days from the date of supply, installation and commissioning. For Imported goods, the preferred payment mode of the Institute is Sight Draft /Net 30 days. If Letter of Credit is insisted by the vendors, the LC will be established for 100% of Purchase Order value out of which 90% will be paid against shipping evidence and 10% after installation and commissioning and on submission of Performance Bank Guarantee for 10% of Purchase Order value which should be valid during warranty period. However the advance payment to the vendors is not encouraged.
